To this end, Confirmation is a pastoral ministry of teaching our youth in order that they can make an adult profession of their faith in Jesus Christ.

Our Confirmation Ministry spans 20 weeks each in the 6th – 8th grades with the Rite of Confirmation taking place on the Reformation Sunday (last Sunday of October) in the student's ninth grade year. 


Needed by our Partners in Ethiopia!

Your Mission and Evangelism Committee has put forward a challenge goal of \$500 to help fund the purchase of a <u>used 4-wheel drive</u> <u>vehicle for the Tabor Congregation's Mission Posts.</u> This vehicle will allow pastors in Ethiopia to visit the remote posts where they provide training, encouragement and support.

The total estimated cost to purchase such a vehicle is \$38,000, due to the 200% vehicle tax in Ethiopia. This will be cost-shared between the Tabor Congregation and our Augustana District. To kick-start this project a District family has committed to a challenge grant of \$9,500.

So, won't you help us meet our goal? The "gas can" will be on the organ to receive your donation.

The Preacher's Ponderings

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

Matthew 5:14-16

Who can deny the gift of light?

Not only do we need light to work by, but if we did not have the light of the sun, how would we be able to raise crops to feed the people of the world?

Yes, light is a gift that we take for granted, yet it is a gift that God gave to us on the first day of His creation (Genesis 1:3), and God declared it "to be good"!

Jesus takes this first gift and also declares that it is a gift that we are to bear to the world. Not as a torch or a signal fire, but by faith in Him we are to shine with the very light of God into the places and into the people who still dwell in darkness.

If you have witnessed a baptism at Hope Lutheran, you will have heard a representative from the congregation make the declaration over the baptized as he or she presented the Baptismal Candle to one of the parents, saying: "Let your light so shine before others so that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in Heaven". So, even before the child is able to comprehend that there is a God, the declaration is upon them to be "light for the world". Thus, just as we bear the cross, sealed on our foreheads as a sign that we have been chosen by God, so too our marching orders are made in Baptism that we are to be "light for the world".

So, how do you think you are doing as be "light for the world"?

How do you think that our partnership together in Hope Lutheran is doing in being "light for the world"?

Please join with us in worship, study, and prayer, so that each of us may take seriously this charge to be the "city set on a hill", to be the "light on the lampstand", and to, without reservation, "let our light shine" to the glory of God!
